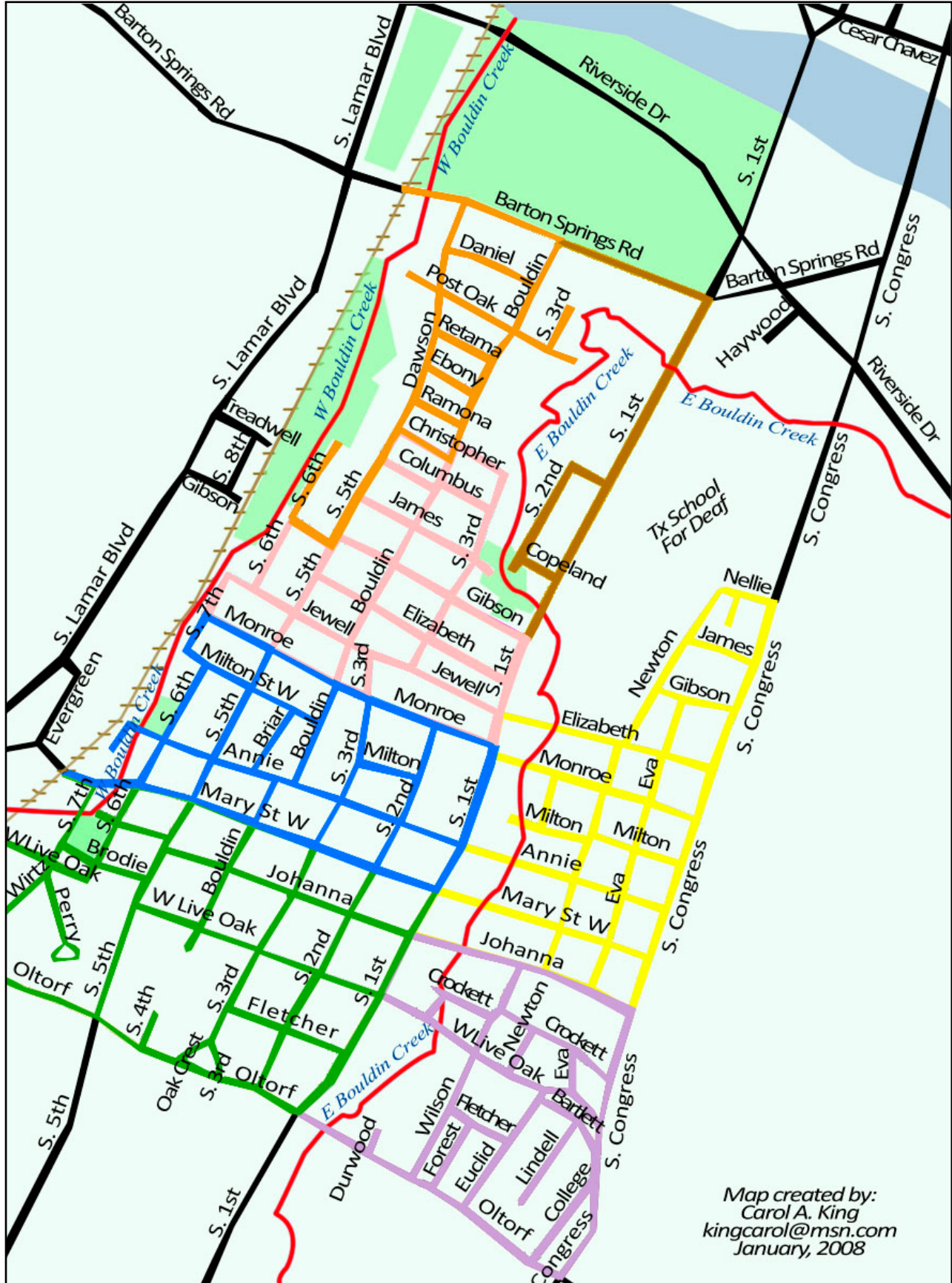

(some substitutions in parenthesis to hide the address)

(This stone house) was constructed by the Home Builders' Association, which consisted of Nicholas A. Dawson, and his older sisters Mollie and Nannie Dawson. It was built on four lots in the South Heights Addition which was platted in 1894 by the Association on forty-four acres acquired from an heir of J.E. Bouldin in 1892. Four other houses of the same basic design and construction technique remain in the neighborhood. Besides the stone houses, the Dawsons also built a number of frame houses in the area during the 1920s as rental property.

The first instance in Austin City Directories of a residence numbered (with this address) is in 1916. (It) is listed as the residence of Edward A. Cooper, with the additional note of "a dairy." Pearl Blackmoore, who resided (here) in 1944 and 1945, and at 1114 S. 5th from 1947 until her death in 1998, stated that she was told by a friend who grew up west of South Lamar, that (this) had been a dairy in 1910, because he passed it daily on his way to and from Fulmore School on South Congress.

The listing for Edward A. Cooper at (this address) continued until 1931, although the "dairy" notation did not appear again after 1924. Arthur C. Cade, who resided (here) during WWII, and at 1206 S. 5th from 1947 until 1978, stated that (this) was a pig farm in the 1920's. In 1930, the directory listed additional residents at 1200: Thomas Burgin, and his wife Vivian. Mr. Burgin's occupation was noted as "traveling." That was the first indication of the use of (this house) as a duplex, which continued until 1945. In the intervening years, the occupants were tradesmen and their families. It was usually occupied by two families as a duplex. See more information on the web site listed above.
